

Standing Rule #1:

Membership dues in the amount of \$20 annually; shall be due December 1 for the following calendar year; and will be delinquent after December 31. Nominees running for office for that following calendar year shall be paid prior to the November meeting.

By-laws – Article VI: #2:

All nominees running for elected offices shall come from the general membership. All nominees must have been members for not less than two years immediately preceding the time of election and have attended five (5) meetings. All nominees shall have computer access for email capability. Nominees running for President should have previous Gateway Board experience.

Article VI: #3

The term of office shall be two (2) years, commencing January 1 through December 31. President, Program Chairman and Newsletter Editor will be elected in odd numbered years. Vice-President, Membership Secretary, Recording Secretary and Treasurer will be elected in even numbered years. This will begin with the 2007 election. An officer may resign their term after one (1) full year and a new officer will be elected for the rest of the term. Beginning with the 2017 election, officers will no longer be subject to term limits.

Article VI: #5:

Vacancies in office or in the case of inactivity of a Board Members shall be filled by a majority vote of the Executive Board. Inactivity shall further be defined as when an officer has failed to attend four (4) consecutive meetings (Board and Chapter).

Article VII #3 – e:

Make a new "e".

Article VII #5-d: Over publicity. Article VII #7b Moved to Article VII #3e.

Article VII #7 c-g Renumber

NEW. Standing Rule #1: Individual membership dues are \$20 annually; shall be due December 1 for the following calendar year and will be delinquent after December 31.

Nominees running for office for that following calendar year shall have dues paid prior to the November meeting.

Reason for change - clarification

Article VI: #2

All nominees running for elected offices shall come from the general membership. All nominees shall have computer access for email capability. Nominees running for President should have previous Gateway Board experience.

Reason for change – too much restriction on who can run for office.

Article VI: #3

The term of office shall be two (2) years, commencing January 1 through December 31. President, Program Chairman and Newsletter Editor will be elected in odd numbered years. Vice-President, Membership Secretary, Recording Secretary and Treasurer will be elected in even numbered years. If an officer resigns, a new officer will be elected for the rest of the term. Officers are not subject to term limits.

Reason for change — timeline is not necessary now and clarified current practice of filling a position.

Article VI: #5:

In the case of inactivity of a Board Member that position shall be filled by a majority vote of the Executive Board. Inactivity shall further be defined as when an officer has failed to attend four (4) consecutive meetings (Board and Chapter). Reason for change – Bring in line with current practice.

Article VII #3 – e: Make a new "e". Over publicity. Article VII #7b

Did you know?

You, the individual chapter member, are the ignition switch that initiates the annual Gold Brush process. You play a very key role that culminates in December at the Christmas Party when the next Gold Brush Award recipient is announced. Your decision to write a name on the Gold Brush Nomination Form should be given as much careful thought and consideration as that of the committee whose solemn duty and responsibility it is to evaluate that nominee.

The June Newsletter article described the quality of chapter service and character traits that a Gold Brush winner should embody. You may want to refresh your memory with a review of that article. Your objective should be to nominate a chapter member who most closely exhibits those desirable qualities and traits. You should be able to list examples of specific actions and activities undertaken by your candidate to support your nomination.

Just how well do you know the person you are thinking of nominating when it comes to their service to the chapter? Do you know how long they have been a chapter member? Do you know if they have ever served on the board – in what positions, for how long, how many times? Have they chaired or served on any committees? How often do they attend chapter meetings, support seminars, or workshops? Do you see them helping to set up for events/activities? Do you see them staying behind to help clean up after a function? Do they regularly volunteer to teach a workshop, retreat class, paint-in project, make-it-take-it? Do they support our chapter charities? Would you consider them a "mover and a shaker"? Do they stand out as a doer and a team player? Are they a leader – someone you can admire and respect? Are they a positive promoter of Gateway Decorative Artists? Do they have a positive and supportive attitude toward the SDP? Do they support the National Museum of Decorative Painting? How many check marks can you put in their plus column? If the answer is many, you are probably on the right track.

Do you know how or from whom to obtain any of the above information you need in order to make an informed decision? Did you know that the Membership Chair keeps a card file on every current, active chapter member that lists a lot of the above information? A simple phone call could answer any questions you might have. This year, as Gold Brush Chair, I also have a spreadsheet listing the same data as the card file in Jo's possession. Another source would be to talk to other members who have served on the same board or committees as your proposed nominee. You have a number of alternative methods of accessing as well as assessing the chapter service and character traits of your candidate. I urge you to avail yourself of them before writing a name on the Gold Brush Nomination Form.

The Gold Brush Award is the highest honor that the chapter can bestow upon a member. It is a once in a lifetime award. Therefore, in order to preserve the integrity and prestige associated with the award, it is important that only the most worthy and deserving member ultimately be chosen. When the next Gold Brush Award recipient is announced, those in attendance should be able to conclude unanimously that the goal has been fulfilled.
