THOUGHTS FOR GOLD BRUSH NOMINATIONS

Did you know?

You, the individual chapter member, are the ignition switch that initiates the annual Gold Brush process. You play a very key role that culminates in December at the Christmas Party when the next Gold Brush Award recipient is announced. Your decision to write a name on the Gold Brush Nomination Form should be given as much careful thought and consideration as that of the committee whose solemn duty and responsibility it is to evaluate that nominee.

Just how well do you know the person you are thinking of nominating when it comes to their service to the chapter? To be eligible for this award the Nominee must have been a member of Gateway Decorative Artists (GDA) for three (3) full consecutive years and have attended three (3) meetings per year. Do you know how long they have been a chapter member? Do you know if they have ever served on the board – in what positions, for how long, how many times? Have they chaired or served on any committees? How often do they attend chapter meetings, support seminars, or workshops? Do you see them helping to set up for events/activities? Do you see them staying behind to help clean up after a function? Do they regularly volunteer to teach a workshop, retreat class, paint-in project, make-it-take -it? Do they support our chapter charities? Would you consider them a "mover and a shaker"? Do they stand out as a doer and a team player? Are they a leader – someone you can admire and respect? Are they a positive promoter of Gateway Decorative Artists? How many check marks can you put in their plus column? If the answer is many, you are probably on the right track.

Do you know how or from whom to obtain any of the above information you need in order to make an informed decision? Did you know that the Membership Chair keeps a card file on every current, active chapter member that lists a lot of the above information? A simple phone call could answer any questions you might have. Another source would be to talk to other members who have served in the same board position, or committees as your proposed nominee. You have several alternative methods of accessing as well as assessing the chapter service and character traits of your candidate. You are urged to avail yourself of them before writing a name on the Gold Brush Nomination Form.

The Gold Brush Award is the highest honor that the chapter can bestow upon a member. It is a once in a life-time award. Therefore, in order to preserve the integrity and prestige associated with the award, it is important that only the worthiest and deserving member ultimately be chosen. When the next Gold Brush Award recipient is announced, those in attendance should be able to conclude unanimously that the goal has been fulfilled.

President Falk discussed the following:

- -The April meeting minutes, and the Treasurer's report were approved as written.
- -The Audit Committee will meet Monday June 17 to conduct the audit of the Chapter finances, the committee is Deb Finklang, Barb Ogden, Gloria Falk and Donna Wessel will attend to answer questions.
- -Having attended the National Convention, Gloria reported on the following:
 - The Chapter received two patches for 2018, having fulfilled the mandatory and selective requirements set by SDP. The second patch is "Chapter of Distinction" which was awarded because a chapter member attended conference, stayed in the host hotel and attended the Chapters Gathering.
 - SDP is replacing the annual conference with 4 regular regional retreats starting in 2020. This November SDP is hosting 4-day intensive skills building class for Certification.

- PLAID is sponsoring 3 Let's Paint classes online, Studio Lesson, Folk-Art One Stroke, and Let's Paint Live. All three of their programs can be found at PlaidOnline.com/LetsPaint.
- At the Chapters Gathering several ideas were floated on how to raise funds for your chapter as well as a flyer on hosting monthly paint-ins to attract new members.

Pink Champagne Layer Cake

Champagne makes any celebration extra-special—especially when the bubbly is baked up in this pretty-in-pink cake!

CAKE 1 pkg. (16.25 oz.) white cake mix with pudding

1 1/4 cups Champagne, at room temperature

1/3 cup oil

3 egg whites 4-5 drops red food coloring

FROSTING 1/2 cup butter, at room temperature

4 cups confectioners' sugar

1/4 cup Champagne, at room temperature

1 tsp. vanilla extract 4-5 drops red food coloring

GARNISHES. OPTIONAL Pink decorating sugar

Edible pink pearls and/or edible pink glitter

Cake: Preheat oven to 350°F (325°F for dark or nonstick pan). Coat bottoms and sides of 2 (8" or 9") round pans with baking spray with flour. In large bowl, stir cake mix and Champagne. Add oil, egg whites and food coloring; beat on medium speed 2 minutes. Pour into pans.

 Bake as directed cake package. Cool 10 minutes. Remove cakes from pans to cooling racks. Cool completely, about 1 hour.

Frosting: In

medium bowl, beat frosting ingredients on medium speed until smooth. On serving plate, place 1 cake layer, rounded side down. Frost top of cake layer. Top with second layer, rounded side up. Frost side and top of cake. Just before serving, sprinkle with garnishes. Store loosely covered.
